Event honors Aga Khan Foundation's Humanitarian Work

Other speakers included Aftab Ghesani, the Southwest Regional Chair of the Foundation; and Aziz Valliani, Chairman of the AFK-U.S.A. National Committee. Guests at the event viewed a video titled ***Do You Dream in Colour? Or, A Better World Is Within Walking Distance***, created by a high-school student in Tanzania, illustrating the poverty in underdeveloped countries and calling for positive action.

The AKF is a non-denominational, philanthropic development agency created by His Holiness the Aga Khan. It is part of The Aga Khan Development Network, an organization of many development agencies which address various aid, growth, and revitalization issues, including health and education, agriculture, humanitarian assistance and microfinance.

According to Scott Curran, CACH's Manager of Investor Relations, the AKDN enables many villages in underdeveloped countries to survive by directly providing water, electricity, and other basic infrastructure to those areas.
